## WHAT'S THE ISSUE?

Australia is a shark and ray "hotspot", home to 322 species of sharks and rays, half of which are found nowhere else in the world (i.e. endemic). The majority of our unique 'Aussies' live in the deep, pitch-black waters along the continental shelf of southern Australia. Being scooped up by trawlers scouring the oceans is their single biggest threat. It's possible we could lose them forever before we even get to know them.

It's possible you may have unknowingly eaten one! Some of our Aussies that are scooped up get sold in fish n chip shops and are often mislabeled as "flake" or "boneless fillet". There's no law that says you accurately label shark meat.

In as little as 8 years, we've seen the risk of extinction in species such as the whitefin swellshark escalate from "Near Threatened" to "Critically Endangered", the final step before being "Extinct".

Australia is seen by shark scientists worldwide as a conservation priority to protect the diversity of the world's sharks and rays. It really is up to us. If we can't save them, no one can?
